

Speech After Stroke: A Manual For The Speech Pathologist And The Family Member





Synopsis

Now in its Second Edition, this clinically proven manual offers practice materials for stimulating speech and language recall in brain-injured patients. New articulation and math exercises have been added as have higher level reading materials for mildly impaired patients. Throughout the book, materials have been redeveloped and expanded to increase their effectiveness. Large print and easily readable type facilitate learning and help those with reduced visual acuity. Five main sections provide illustrations and developmental exercises in speech comprehension, imitative ability and articulation, vocabulary and syntax, reading and money skills, and writing skills. Each section progresses from the simple to the complex; exercises are included for patients whose impairments range from mild to severe. The directions for applying the exercises are written in nontechnical language so they can be used by family members as well as by speech pathologists. Discussions of recovery time and of the limits of improvement are included, as is a list of suggested readings.

As a family member of a stroke survivor who is dealing with expressive Aphasia, I found this book to be extremely helpful. It is written in easily understandable language, and organized in an order that is simple to follow. Yet there is nothing lacking in terms of practical and useful materials and exercises that will aid in the recovery process.Not only are oral speech and language abilities addressed, but also writing ability and reading comprehension. This text also includes materials that

will aid in rebuilding skills related to money, math and telling time. Exercises are all provided in bold, large print... making them very easy for family members and patients to read and use. It is an unfortunate fact that many insurance companies refuse to pay for ongoing, intensive speech and language therapy for stroke survivors (beyond the first few weeks). After that time, many survivors receive only a minimal amount of S&L therapy, unless their family members willingly step in to assist. While it is definitely preferable to have post-stroke aphasia therapy outlined and over-seen by an actual SLP... this book provides the necessary guidance and materials that will allow families to supplement and continue forward with their loved one's therapy and recovery.

Perhaps I would have found this more useful immediately after the stroke. It wasn't much help for additional skill building later. It was hard to determine where to find information for the concerns that we had and reading the entire thing was tedious. So much information was either far above or far below the level of function that we were looking for. It would have been nice if the organization schema made it easier to find what we were looking for.

Using this at home to help, in conjunction with speech therapy elsewhere. Very good practice, easy to follow exercise by exercise. If you "slip" and don't use it for a while, easy to pick back up later without a problem. Thank you to the authors for helping families to help their loved ones at home with this manual.

As a speech pathologist working in home care with adults, this is one of my favorite books to use with my aphasic patients. However, the binding of the book is very poor quality and my \$60 book is now falling apart.
