

What I immediately liked about this book is that you can tell the author is a teacher, not just someone who knows Spanish, so the book is laid out in a way that makes sense for learners. It's not just a dry list of verbs and how to conjugate them. It is written in a conversational style that makes you feel like you're in a friendly classroom. It is well organized, with summaries at the beginning and end of each chapter to help you keep track of your learning and make sure you've grasped everything before you move on. This book takes the complex subject of conjugating Spanish verbs and lays it out in a way that is clear and understandable. The printable flash cards are also a great help! All in all, an excellent resource for anyone learning Spanish.

This well-written guide to Spanish verb conjugations is one of the most useful I've come across, catering equally for the novice and intermediate student. This author knows her cebollas! The tasks are presented in a fun way, and at the same time the book is well-structured and easy to

follow. Small differences in conjugation are pointed out between Spain and other Hispanic countries. The advantage is that you can learn at your own pace, unlike in a classroom session where you are forced to learn at the pace of the rest of the the class. It's good, simple, honest, and well-priced, and a pleasure to use. In short, buy this book!

The author's approach is simple: take one each of the -ar, -er, and -ir verbs, practice their conjugations, then apply these newly-acquired rules to the mastery of a whole lot of regular verbs. This book depends on where you are and what your approach is to learning Spanish. In my case, Spanish will be a third language, I'm currently working on it solo, and don't want to shell out \$400 for software. Having a prior language taught me that if I'm struggling and fatigued, this means I'm doing it right; learning languages is hard work. So I practiced the conjugations on the hellish elliptical at the health club and not only got them reasonably down, but it made the exercise go faster to boot. Now I find I'm much, much better prepared to start picking up nouns and reading simple passages, a sentence or two.My practice method is not to buy a book like 501 Spanish verbs, fully conjugated, but rather to acquire the rules and really drive them home by WRITING the pages of 501 Spanish verbs, fully conjugated. Anything we do ourselves is more memorable, and it seems to be working. This is the second step I took in learning Spanish, and it appears to have been a smart one, as Spanish is more verb-conjugation dependent than English or German. I think anyone who's willing to work and wanting to get booted up in Spanish by the "direct route" will find this an excellent starting place.

I prefer to learn as much as I can through immersion, but I also need to know WHY things work the way they do. For verbs, this book really helps me get a grip on why the verb is conjugated a certain way, or how it can affect other words in the construction. This book is well thought out, definitely not just slapped together for a quick buck. Everything comes together very logically, and even though I haven't been able to print the flashcards off yet, keeping them on my tablet to read through when I have a few free minutes has been helpful as well.

Like many Americans, I took Spanish in high school and immediately forgot it after the last test. As an adult, I regret doing so since there are so many opportunities to use it in daily life. This book is a great resource for Spanish learners of all levels. Maybe you want to brush up real fast before a trip to Mexico. Maybe you want to aim toward fluency and need a simple resource to keep track of your verbs. Maybe you want to finally conquer all those pesky irregular verbs and the subjunctive form.

Whatever it is, this book is suitable to learners of all levels. And it has an unbeatable price!

Verbs are the backbone of any language and Linda Plummer has organized this book in a clear and concise way which makes the arduous task of learning less painful. The added bonus of flashcards will speed up the process. So much for so little ... amazing!

If you know what a pluperfect or preterite tense is (just to name a few of countless examples) and if that helps you learn Spanish, this book may be for you. I just got absolutely lost in the sea of English teacher jargon used to explain something that is already complex enough. Not enough examples, too much tech talk. Sorry Linda, I wanted to like this, but after several chapters I'm throwing in the towel, and will be looking for something with lots and lots of examples.

In my early 20th I lived in Karlsruhe Germany and I had the opportunity to learn German; I actually took classes, but the instructor only spoke German and I got frustrated and didn't return after 2 classes. I had friends there who spoke 2 - 5 languages and when Conquer 918 Spanish Verbs was recommended to me I thought of my missed opportunity in not learning another language. I'm very interested in learning Spanish verbs and I believe that this book will help me accomplish that, because of its 7 step by step straightforwardness that will help me progress through each step. Each step as its own foundation that allows me to move on to the next step and the 244 Spanish flash cars helps a hold lot, if you use them to play a game, that make the learning experience fun. That's why I believe this book is very helpful, well written and provides explanations that is basic enough that I can understand them and you will too.
