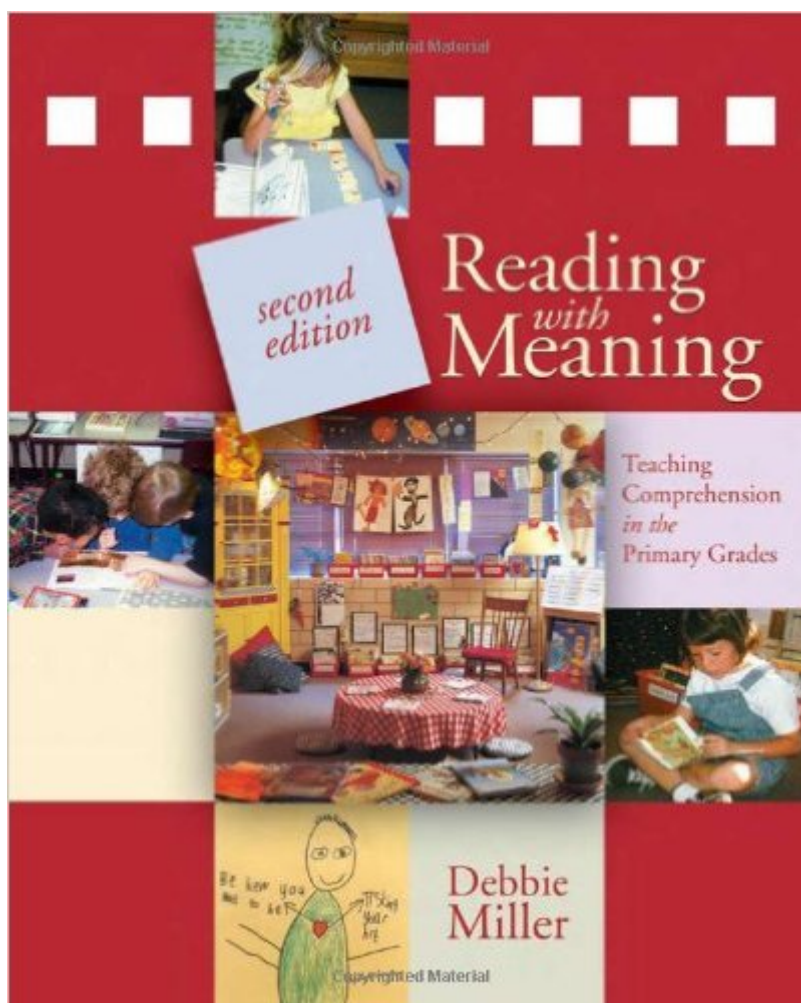

This is a great book for both new and "seasoned" teachers. I have to admit, it's a little hard to let go of monitoring every single word my students read, but once I started utilizing her reading club structure, I found that my children are MUCH more excited about reading. I am giving them difficult comprehension questions, and even the struggling readers are doing well. John Hattie and other experts in the field of education have found evidence that peer discussions, grouped both heterogeneously and homogeneously, lead to raised student performance. I find her suggestions and book lists to be very helpful. It's an enjoyable read and I finished it over a weekend. Now my students are enjoying the influences of Ms. Miller's ideas mixed in with mine. Excellent!

Some teaching books are written from the perspective of "I'm perfect. If you're not you're not doing it right." This book speaks directly to me: a perfectly imperfect teacher. She puts so much of her research IN THE BOOK. She puts the things she figured out, the lessons she learned, and even plots out her teaching plan month-to-month IN THE BOOK.
